



### Terms of Sale:




First American edition. 215 pp. Navy paper covered boards quarter bound in purple cloth with blue lettering on the spine and blue endpapers and pastedowns. Price of \$6.95 on front flap of dust jacket. First printing of the first American edition. A Near Fine book with some slight wear to the edges of the boards in a like dust jacket with a few hints of edge wear and a tiny tear to the front panel. A nice copy of the first book in Adams' enduringly popular comic series concerning Arthur Dent and his adventures through time and space. **\$150.00**

2. Berryman, John. **The Dream Songs**. New York: Farrar, Straus and Giroux (1969). First edition. 427 pp. Price of \$10.00 on front flap of dust jacket. Stefanik A 18.l.a. A very near Fine book in a very near Fine dust jacket with minor wrinkling to the top of the spine panel. Hailed by the American Academy of Poets as one of the "Groundbreaking Books of the 20th century", this volume collects Berryman's poetry, "77 Dream Songs", and "His Toy, His Dream, His Rest", winners of the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Award respectively. **\$75.00**




3. Burnett, W. R. **Vanity Row**. New York: Alfred A. Knopf, 1952. First edition. 276 pp. Price of \$3.00 on front flap of jacket. Hubin 120. A Very Good+ book with evidence of an address label's removal on the free front endpaper and some mild discoloration to the top stain in a Near Fine dust jacket with a few hints of edge wear and rubbing and a small crease to each of the flaps. The basis for the 1956 film "Accused of Murder", a classic mystery novel set in the world of big-city corruption. A nice copy of Burnett's twenty-first novel. **\$100.00**

4. Bray, Martha Coleman; Bray, Edmund C. **Joseph N. Nicollet on the Plains and Prairies** The Expeditions of 1838-39 With Journals, Letters, and Notes on the Dakota Indians. St. Paul, MN: Minnesota Historical Society Press, 1976. First edition. 294 pp. Price of \$14.50 on front flap of jacket. A very near Fine book with minor offsetting to the verso of the free front endpaper in a Near Fine dust jacket with some minor wrinkling to the rear panel and a few hints of edge wear. The journals of Joseph N. Nicollet, an important explorer who documented the geography of the Coteau plains and large parts of the Mississippi and Missouri rivers (and of course, Minnesota). Nicollet was well-known for recording the Native American names of the places he explored. His writings on Native Americans are notably progressive for the time. **\$50.00**




Thirteenth-Thousandth, the second printing of the sixth edition (the first to be printed from electrotpe) as per Lovett [7]. 192 pp. Small 8vo. With forty-two illustrations by John Tenniel. In a contemporary fine binding by Zaehnsdorf, 3/4 rich red leather with all edges gilt, gold lettering and five raised bands on the spine, and marbled boards and endpapers. A Near Fine book with scattered minor age toning and smudges, discreet professional strengthening to the joints, and a tiny tear to the first leaf after the title page. A beautiful copy of this children's classic. **\$850.00**





Some hints of wear to the extremities of the boards, a former (contemporary) owner's name written on the front pastedown in both volumes, some light bumping to the corners of the boards, the fold-outs have some creasing and a few tiny tears. A Very Good book with age toning to the spine, a few hints of wear to the extremities, some offsetting to the free front endpaper and pastedowns, and a tiny hole (likely caused by an insect) in the top textblock. A nice copy of Remington's first book. **\$200.00**




Noted for her use of words and language patterns reflective of the Lakota language, Sandoz's evocative biography is written from the perspective of the Lakota people. A beautiful copy of what is widely considered to be Sandoz's best and most important work. **\$700.00**
